
Mulch or compost it



Some weedy woody trees and shrubs can be mulched or composted at home, turning them into useful organic material.

Make sure, though, that you don't compost any parts of the plant that can survive to grow again, such as seeds, berries, tubers or rhizomes. Dispose of these at your local refuse transfer station.

Shredding leaves and branches in a garden mulcher speeds up the composting process. Covering the pile of weeds with heavy black plastic can also help.
